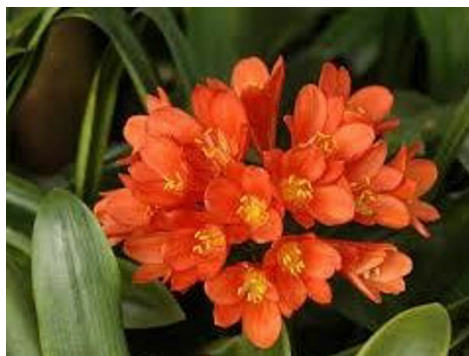


Clivia miniata Belgian Hybrid

Flowers are showy and trumpet shaped. The fruit that follows also decorative. Can be used as indoor plant. Flowers best in a crowded pot where roots are restricted.
