Cultural Notes:

Prefers well drained, rich soils with plenty of organic matter added. Prune spent flowers as they die off. Feed with a specialised Azalea/Camellia fertiliser. Water well during hot and dry periods. A light prune in Spring will keep plant looking bushy and tidy.

Plant Care:

Annual slow release fertiliser, Keep moist during dry periods, Mulch well
