Vigorous native climber / trailing plant with dark green leaves and long bright white pea-shaped flowers appearing in Autumn and continuing through until Spring. Useful for densely covering walls and slopes. Looks great when planted on mass.

Shallow rooting and fast growing, Hardenbergias do not tolerate waterlogged soils. Prune regularly to shape and refresh growth. Will flower best if full sun.

Keep moist during dry periods, Low phosphorus slow release fertiliser, Mulch well
