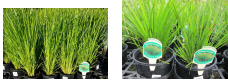


Lomandra confertifolia Little Pal

Description:

Attractive lime green foliated native tufting perennial with high tolerances towards wind, saltspray, poor soils and drought. Summer flowering small, creamy flowers are held within the foliage. Very versatile, this grass is great mass planting, borders, driveways and courtyards. Suitable for mass planting in public spaces. Grows approximately 60cm tall x 70cm wide.
