Looks best when planted on mass and next to contrasting colours and textures.

Cultural Notes:

Plant dies back in cooler weather. Cut off spent flower heads before new growth begins in early Spring. Can easily be divided. Watch out for Aphids and snails, they love the fleshy foliage. Liquid feed in the growing season.

Plant Care:

Annual slow release fertiliser, Keep moist during dry periods, Liquid feed, Mulch well
