Pruning is unnecessary, however, crossed or competing branches can be removed while the plant is young to improve its shape. Water well in hotter months to help reduce chance of leaf burn. Apply slow release fertilizer after flowering in spring.

Annual slow release fertiliser, Keep moist during dry periods, Mulch well
