SmallTalk Red flowers generally do not have to be removed. They pass from shades of red, white and green.

Cultural Notes:

Needs the right light conditions to thrive - bright indirect sunlight in a sheltered spot. Wipe the leaves with water regularly to remove any dust and insects. Potted plants benefit from a weak fertilizer solution every other week. Keep soil moist, but do not over-water. Leaves will yellow if inadequate water. Keep an look out for mealy bugs.

Plant Care:

Annual slow release fertiliser, Keep moist during dry periods, Liquid feed, Mulch well
