Description:

Also called Anemone hupehensis. Late summer flowering perennial with lobed leaves and tall, branching flower stems that produce rose coloured blooms. Great for under trees, planted in borders. Grows approx 1.2m tall and 40cm wide.

Mature Width: 30-60cm **Soil Type:** Well Drained

Landscape Use(s): Borders / Shrubbery, Coastal Garden, Courtyard, Feature, Formal Garden, Groundcover, Mass Planting, Container / Pot, Under Trees

Aphids, Generally trouble free, Snails And Slugs

Cultural Notes:

Best grown in moist, well drained soil, in a protected partly shady position. Liquid fertilise in spring. Cut back in late autumn. Caution: Irritant to skin and eyes. Harmful if eaten.

Plant Care:

Annual slow release fertiliser, Keep moist during dry periods, Liquid feed, Mulch well
