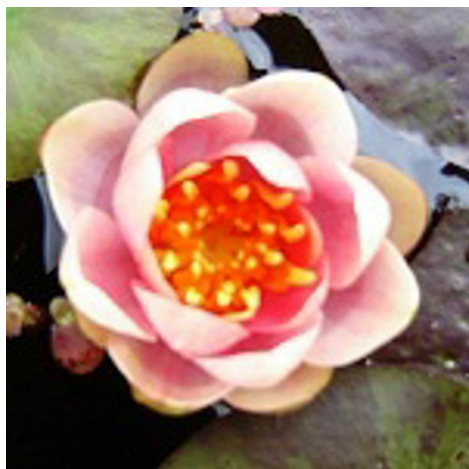


Nymphaea hybrida Apricot

Ensure the pond or water source has overall good health and the plant should thrive. Requires still water. you can remove any spent flowers and prune any old foliage. If the plant is getting too large you can transplant into a larger pot. Requires protection from frost.
