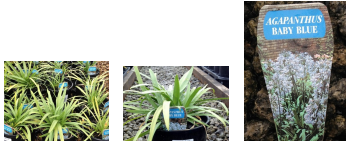

Tough plant, adaptable to poor soils and coastal conditions. Water well during the flowering period. Tidy plant by removing old leaves - wear gloves as sap can irritate the skin. Plant can be easily divided.

Annual slow release fertiliser, Keep moist during dry periods, Mulch well
