Salvia Blue Bouquetta is super compact growing to only 20cm high and wide. It is very well branched which means a huge amount of flowers. During Spring, through Summer and into Autumn, masses of intense purple flowers grace the soft grey/green foliage. Blue Bouquetta is great for perennial borders, as a solitary on balconies and terraces and combined with other plants. Very profuse, repeat bloomer, intense blue-purple flower, very compact and strong habit.
