Description:

Rhizomatous perennial with glossy green, succulent pinnate leaflets. New leaves emerge on upright spikes from tubers under the soil upright spikes and gradually unfold. Very popular indoor plant, not only for its architecturally striking foliage, but also because of its tolerance to low light and lack of water. Can be grown outdoors in dry, shaded sites and protected from the cold. Grows approx 60-90cm tall.

Keep out of direct sunlight. Will grow in low light areas and shady corners. Water sparingly, once a month is ample and less in winter. Apply a slow release fertiliser in Spring. Caution : Harmful if eaten. May irritate skin and eyes. All parts of the plant are poisonous.
