Wonderful, soft native tufting plant with blue new season growth that matures to green. With flowers positioned deep in the foliage it is well suited to high pedestrian areas and is child friendly, as there is little danger from getting spiked by drying flowers. The fine leaves of Crackerjack sway gracefully in the wind, which creates the feeling of a soft, whimsical element, contrasting perfectly with hard paved surfaces. Grows approx 70cm tall x 1m wide.
