Attractive rare variety of crabapple, with an upright conical habit and maple-like leaves turning burgundy and yellow in late Autumn. Large white flowers appear in Summer. Great to use as a feature tree or plant in groups for a impact. Grows approx 5-7m tall x 3-5m wide.
