Cultural Notes:

Prefers well drained, sandy loam soil in a sunny position. Tolerates alkaline soils. Copes well with dry spells and moderate frosts. Prune after flowering to maintain density and shape. Feed in early Spring with a low phosphorus slow release fertiliser.

Plant Care:

Keep moist during dry periods, Low phosphorus slow release fertiliser, Mulch well
