Description:

Small Australian native tree that naturally occurs in New South Wales and Victoria. Has distinct juvenile leaves that are rounded silver-grey turning into adult ovate leaves. Attractive specimen tree suited to open spaces and broad streets. Suitable for planting in a large container.

Cultural Notes:

Water deeply for the first year. Water 1-2 times per week during dry periods whilst establishing. Feed with a suitable fertiliser in Autumn and Spring. Mulch annually to conserve water and assist with weed suppression. Healthy plants should have no pest and disease issues.

Plant Care:

Keep moist during dry periods, Low phosphorus slow release fertiliser, Mulch well
