Description:

A beautiful variegated, compact, slow-growing shrub. The foliage is green with white margins giving a silvery appearance. Growing to approximately 80cm high by 60cm it makes an ideal hedging choice or feature planting to add some bright colour to the garden.

Water well until established. Prefers moist, well drained soil with plenty of organic matter. Performs better in cooler climates, not for hot, dry climates. Maintains great colour year round. Benefits from liquid feeding in the warmer months. Trim regularly to maintain shape as required. Plant 3 -4 per metre for a hedge.

Annual slow release fertiliser, Keep moist during dry periods, Mulch well
