## Parthenocissus henryana

**Botanical Name:** Parthenocissus henryana  
**Common Names:** Chinese Virginia Creeper, Silver Vein Creeper, Ivy,

### Description:

Fast-growing climber with green tri-lobbed leaves turning a deep red, orange and purple in the cooler months before they fall off. Climbs on tendrils so won't damage the structure it's covering. Use to create the illusion of a bigger garden (vertically) if planting area is small. Spreads approx. 10m.
