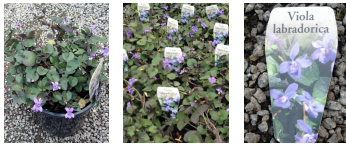


Viola labradorica

Beautiful mat-forming prostrate groundcover with an attractive blue-purple flower and dark-green purple tinged leaves. Great for shady gardens, between pavers and in rockeries. Grows approx. 10cm tall x 30cm wide.

Low maintenance, but may spread into unwanted areas, remove when necessary. Tolerates shade and adapts to most soil conditions. Plant 10cm apart for quick coverage and prune when necessary.

Annual slow release fertiliser, Keep moist during dry periods, Liquid feed, Mulch well
