### Description:

Compact succulent perennial with dark-green dense foliage and a shrubby habit. Unique, lime-green flower heads appear from Spring to Summer. Easy to grow, a staple in many cottage gardens. Grows approx. 50cm x 50cm.

### Cultural Notes:

Low water requirements, dry tolerant once established. Plant in most soil types that have good drainage. Euphorbias do not like wet feet. Feed in Spring with a slow release fertiliser for optimum results. Pruning generally not required although cutting back spent flower stems to base will encourage a bushier habit. Take care to avoid skin contact with the milky sap as it can be irritating to some - wear gloves and dispose of cuttings. CAUTION - Harmful if eaten/skin & eye irritant.

### Plant Care:

Annual slow release fertiliser
