Prune after flowering to keep plant looking bushy. Feed early spring with a low phosphorus slow release fertiliser. Drought tolerant once established. If planted in a container, use a good quality native potting mix. Mulch Well. Prefers a well drained soil.

**Plant Care:**

Keep moist during dry periods, Low phosphorus slow release fertiliser, Mulch well
