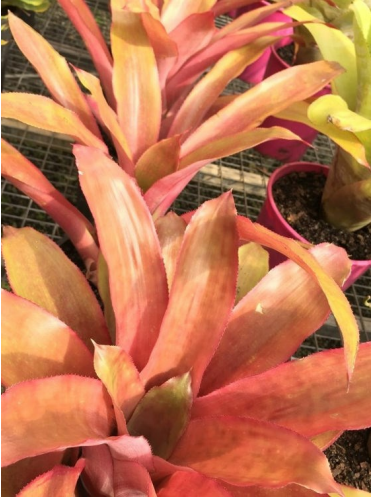


Aechmea lueddemanniana
