Nandina 'Twilight' makes a fine choice for adding a splash of colour to your outdoor area. This hardy evergreen shrub is perfect for providing year round interest; new foliage emerges flamingo pink and bronze, before colouring to variegated green and cream. In Summer, the starry white flowers add to the display, followed by red berries in Autumn. This is a very attractive Nandina with a neat, upright habit that is perfect for adding year round colour in pots, garden beds and borders.
