Native to South Australia a fast growing hardy shrub to small tree. Narrow silvery green foliage that have a weeping habit, and yellow globular flowers that bloom throughout the year with its peak show in spring.

Plant in moist well drained soil and apply an organic mulch. Fertilise with a native specific fertiliser. Light pruning throughout the development of the plant will keep it vigorous and encourage bushiness.

Keep moist during dry periods, Low phosphorus slow release fertiliser, Mulch well
