Attractive small native spreading shrub with long oval-shaped green foliage and clusters of spider-like red flowers for most of the year. Great as small hedge. Grows approx 1m-1.5m tall x 2m wide. Bird attracting.

Prune after flowering to keep a neat, bushy appearance. Feed with a low phosphorus slow release fertiliser. Promote flowering by watering often during the warmer months.

Keep moist during dry periods, Low phosphorus slow release fertiliser, Mulch well
