Description:

Large upright evergreen shrub with shiny dark green foliage and beautiful large mid-pink formal double flowers. Flowers appear from Winter through to Spring. Great for planting under trees or in a semi-shade position, growing to around 2.5m tall.

Mature Width: 1-2m **Soil Type:** Loam, Sandy, Well Drained

Landscape Use(s): Courtyard, Cut Flower, Feature, Formal Garden, Mass Planting, Shady Garden

Aphids, Generally trouble free, Scale

Cultural Notes:

Prefers well drained, rich soils with plenty of organic matter added. Prune spent flowers as they die off. Feed with a specialised Azalea/Camellia fertiliser. Water well during hot and dry periods. A light prune in Spring will keep plant looking bushy and tidy.
