### Cultural Notes:

Prefers a semi-shaded to full sun position. Best in well-drained fertile garden soil that has had organic matter added. Mulch in Spring. Caution - harmful if eaten / skin irritant. Plant bulbs in Autumn. Plant 10cm apart. A spring flowering perennial that will grow to approximately 10-20cm tall by 10-20cm in width. Loved for its showy miniature.

### Plant Care:

Keep moist during dry periods, Liquid feed, Mulch well
