

Rosa Dublin Bay



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Botanical Name: Rosa Dublin Bay

Description:

The Dublin Bay Rose is a vigorous Climbing Rose that covers itself with masses of bright red slightly fragrant blooms that repeat flower. It has a high resistance to diseases and can be grown up pillars or trellised against a wall or fence making it an excellent variety for a great vertical display in the landscape.

Cultural Notes:

Needs to be planted in well drained soil that has a high amount of organic matter. When planting ensure the grafting bud is above soil level. Mulch with an organic mulch. Fertilize regularly throughout the growing season with a rose specific fertilizer. Pruning can be done regularly throughout the growing season by removing spent blooms which encourages repeat flowering. Hard pruning is undertaken in winter once the plant has gone dormant taking about 70% of the branches off to keep healthy form.

Annual slow release fertiliser, Keep moist during dry periods, Liquid feed, Mulch well
