Hardy fast-growing biennial with green leaves and tall green stems. Crisp stems and fine aromatic leaves are edible and are great to use in soups, stews and salads.

Prefers a sunny position in a moist well-drained soil. Stems can be harvested in Spring through to Autumn. Plant at the beginning of Spring. Space 30cm apart. Preferred soil PH is 5.5-6.8. For crispy stems keep them covered from sunlight.

Keep moist during dry periods, Liquid feed, Mulch well
