Cultural Notes:

Prefers moist, well drained or poorly drained soils. Propagates easily by division - separate the root stems. Will scorch in full sun. Remove spent flower heads, if time is short, you can mow over the flowers for a quick tidy up.

Plant Care:

Annual slow release fertiliser, Keep moist during dry periods, Liquid feed, Mulch well
