Hardy, easy to grow, upright perennial which produces masses of sky-blue flowers from Spring through to Autumn. Ideal for low water and cottage themed gardens. Grows approx. 1m tall x 1m wide.

Prefers full sun in most soil types with good drainage. Dry tolerant once established with an occasional deep water. In the beginning of spring cut back old foliage stems once fresh growth begins to appear at the base. Feed at this time with an application of slow release or liquid fertiliser for best results.

Annual slow release fertiliser, Keep moist during dry periods, Liquid feed, Mulch well
