**Botanical Name:** Agonis flexuosa After Dark  
**Common Names:** Black Agonis, Black Willow Myrtle, Black Willow Peppermint, WA Peppermint,  
**Native:** Yes  
**Foliage Type:** Evergreen  
**Plant Type:** Hedging / Screening, Shrubs, Trees  
**Plant Habit:** Pendulous

### Description:

Medium sized native tree with year round deep burgundy, almost black foliage. Grows to approx 5m and makes a striking feature tree or loose screen. Can tolerate coastal conditions and wind, but foliage can look scrappy and dry if it doesn't receive adequate water. Use for foliage colour, prune regularly to maintain density.
