Will tolerate waterlogged sites and drought tolerant once established. Great as a specimen plant or for a low hedge. Grows approx 90cm tall x 70cm wide

Regular pruning is not necessary, but a light pruning after flowering will keep it compact. Benefits from a light sprinkling of blood and bone annually. Prefers neutral to acid soil in a sunny position.

Keep moist during dry periods, Low phosphorus slow release fertiliser, Mulch well
